Day of Sucwentwecw

April 7th is a Day of Recognition of the Secwepemc people and their territory. Schools will be holding assemblies followed by activities related to learning more about the Secwepemc people and Identity through Story Telling. David Thompson Elementary will be holding an assembly on Thursday, April 7, 2016.

PARENT PROTOCOL OF SCHOOL ISSUES AND CONCERNS

Parents/Guardians, if there are any concerns about a particular classroom situation, please discuss the circumstances with the teacher. When requiring a time to speak with a teacher, please phone/email ahead of time and make arrangements to meet with the teacher at a non-teaching time when students are not present. This provides the opportunity for a positive productive meeting.

Non-instructional day

Monday, April 18th is a non-instructional day for teachers. There will be no school for students that day.

TICKS

The time to be on the look-out for ticks has arrived.

PREVENTION:

before going outdoors in a tick-infested area (bushes, grass, fields, trails) use the following precautions:

- Put on light-coloured clothing and tuck pant legs into socks
- Apply an insect repellant containing DEET to exposed areas of skin or to clothing. Apply carefully around eyes and mouth.
- Children and pregnant women should use a lower concentration DEET product
- Don't put repellent on small children's hands because they often put their hands in their mouths
- After returning indoors, wash the repellent off with soap and water

HOME TREATMENT:

- Check regularly for ticks when you are out in the woods, and thoroughly examine your skin and scalp when you return home. Check your pets too. The sooner ticks are removed, the less likely they are to spread infection.
- Remove a tick using one of these methods- (i) using tweezers, gently pull on the tick, as close to the skin as possible. Pull straight out and try not to crush the tick's body.(ii) gently tighten a loop of thread around the head of the tick (not the body) and slowly pull the tick away from the skin with the thread.
- wash the area with soap and water, and apply an antiseptic. Save the tick in a jar for tests in case you develop flu-like symptoms after you have been bitten.

WHEN TO CALL A HEALTH PROFESSIONAL:

- if you are unable to remove the entire tick
- if a tick has been attached for more than 24 hours and you live in an area where Lyme disease is common.
- if you develop a red rash that may look like a bull's eye and expands over several days, especially if you know you were recently exposed to ticks. The rash may or may not be in the same location you were bitten, and may be accompanied by flu-like symptoms, such as fatigue, headache, stiff neck, fever, chills or body aches.
